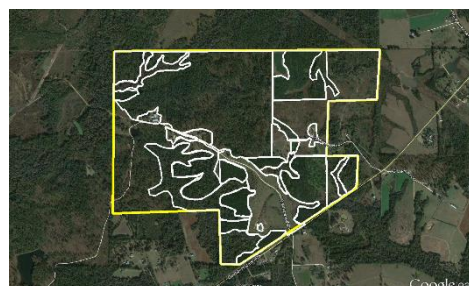

About Google Earth Pro

Google Earth Pro (GEP) is a free online computer mapping program. It provides satellite imagery of the entire globe. Forest landowners can use GEP to:

- identify property boundaries
- outline specific tracts on your property
- calculate acreages and distances
- create “pushpins” to describe certain features
- save all files on your computer or in the “cloud”
- make better land management decisions

Continuing Education Hours Offered:

- Loggers—4 hours, Category 1.
- Foresters—4 hours, Category 2.

Forest Management Plans

- Are a guide to help landowners, not a contract
- Identify objectives of the landowner
- Contain information on acreage, important contacts, and measures to protect valuable natural resources
- Are generally good for 10 years
- May require the assistance of private governmental, or other forestry professionals
