


4-H Cloverbuds Fun Day (5-7 Year Olds as of January 1, 2024)

Livestock Information





You can increase your knowledge of poultry management practices and life skills in the 4-H Poultry Chain. You have the opportunity to raise birds to sexual maturity while keeping a record of their progress. At the end of the project you will choose your top 3 birds to compete at the Mississippi State Fair in the poultry show. If you are a Cloverbud (ages 5-7 as of January 1, 2024) you will be able to compete on a county level. 4-H'ers ages 8-18 will be able to compete on the county and state level. You can only show one breed (females only) and must order at least 6 chicks (It is recommended that you order 20). There are 2 categories for chicks: Meat Category and Layer Category (call the office for a list of breeds). You must order your chicks from a NPIP-certified hatchery or a commercial operation that is supplied by an NPIP hatchery. Do NOT order from a NPIP-backyard flock. Now is the time to order your chicks to be delivered the week of May 19-25, 2024. You will need to register between April 1 and June 15 by calling the county office. There is an award for the Cutest Coop, for showmanship and for the show. Call the Pearl River County Extension Service Office at 601-403-2280 for more information.



Mississippi 4-H Wildlife Art & Photography Contests



The Mississippi 4-H Wildlife Art and Photography Contest is one opportunity to show off your talent or skill! The Art categories are Pastels/Charcoal/Graphite/Colored Pencil (Abstract or Realistic), Oil/Acrylic/Watercolor (Abstract or Realistic), Pen/Ink/Markers/Crayon (Abstract or Realistic), Cartoon, Sculpture/3-D and Mixed, Altered Media. Photography categories are Action, Non-Action and Human Interest (Digital only). Photographs must be 5"x7" format in sleeve. Age divisions are 8-13 years old and 14-18 years old (as of January 1, 2024). Entries are due in the Pearl River County Extension Service Office by **Friday**, **April 19, 2024**. The top 5 entries in each category will go on to be judged at the district level, top 5 there go on to Region level, top 5 there go on to State Level, and the top 5 in the state will go on to be displayed at the MS Wildlife Expo in Jackson in late July/Early August. Ribbons, rosettes and other prizes will be given on the State level. Call the Pearl River County 4-H Extension Service Office at 601-403-2280 for more details.

Staying Safe in the Sun

Because the days are getting longer, the temperatures are getting warmer and people are wanting to spend more time outdoors, let's talk about staying safe in the sun! How do you know if you have too much exposure to the sun? If you have a fairer complexion it can increase your risk, but excessive ultraviolet light can cause problems in all skin types, depending on the degree of exposure. Generally if the sun causes any redness or discomfort, then you have too much exposure. Some medications may cause problems with the effects of sunlight. Check with your doctor and pharmacist.

To protect yourself from excessive ultraviolet rays, follow these guidelines:

- Use sunscreen lotions and creams with skin protection factors (SPF) of 30. Follow the directions for the highest level of protection. You will need to reapply more often to your nose, feet, earlobes and bald spots. If you use sports formulas they will last longer, even through heavy perspiration. Replace lotions and creams every year and write the date of purchase on the container.
- Try not to be in the sun between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. as much as possible
- You can wear a hat and tightly woven clothing to shield covered body areas from exposure. If you wear a broad-rimmed hat (3– to 4-inch brim) it will protect your face and neck.
- Look for sunglasses that block most UVA and UVB light.

By following these tips you will almost totally prevent the ill effects of the sun. It's well worth the effort to take care of yourself now. In the long run you can prevent skin cancer, cataracts, premature aging, burns, lower immunity to illness and macular degeneration (a leading cause of blindness in adults).
