Exhibitors: All exhibitors should live in Lee County. <u>No professionals may enter exhibits</u> in their area of specialty. A professional is one who teaches or sells goods or services for a fee in their area of specialty.

The exhibitor must have completed entries since September, 2016. <u>Items that have been exhibited at previous Lee County Exhibit Days, regardless of Division, Class, Category or Lot, are not eligible for entry</u>. Staff reserves the right to reject any exhibit due to space, quality, or other reasons.

To expedite registration, it is recommended that you obtain an Exhibitor number and entry tags from the Extension Office prior to check-in. <u>NO PRE-REGISTRATION FORM REQUIRED</u>.

Adult exhibitors are limited to 30 total entries.

No exhibit entries will be accepted by mail. All exhibits, except Baked Goods, must remain in the Exhibit Hall until the announced check out date.

Each entry will be judged based on its own merit. Decisions of the judges are final. <u>Judges will not award a ribbon to any item because of its mere presence</u>. When only one exhibit is in a Category or Lot, judges may recommend no award based on its merit. Awards are based on the judges' decisions.

The Exhibit Committee reserves the right to amend or interpret Exhibit Rules and to arbitrarily settle and determine all questions and differences arising in regard to these rules. Staff reserves the right to refuse or to accept conditionally any exhibit offered and the right to display it or not.

While every precaution will be taken to safeguard the same, neither the management nor workers will be responsible for any loss, damage or accident that may occur.

Best of Show ribbons pay \$15; Blue Ribbons pay \$6 and Red Ribbons pay \$3. White Ribbons or disqualified entries pay no premium.

General Information

Articles that have been exhibited at previous Lee County Exhibit Days are not eligible for entry. Judging will be based on: Workmanship – 50%; Originality – 25%; Appearance – 25% (except Writing Division).

Entries should be double spaced and typed, if possible. Short stories are limited to 1,000 words; essays to 750 words; and poetry to one page.

Photos will be judged on: Composition – 33%; Quality of Workmanship (tone, grain, sharpness, clearness) – 33%; Overall Appearance of Entry – 33%.

Exhibits of two or more items must be attached together and entry tag attached.

Judging will be based on: Workmanship – 50%; Originality – 25%; Appearance – 25%.

Division: Foods - Canned & Dried

All produce must have been canned since **September**, **2016**. Exhibits that do not comply will be disqualified. Canned products are to be in standard, ring-type, canning jars (quart, pint, half pint); sealed with <u>rings left on</u>. Rings should be free of rust. Jars should be filled to the neck of the jar with the proper headspace allowed. Headspace is the amount of space from the top of the canned product to the underside of the jar lid. Allow ¼" headspace for jams, jellies, and preserves; ½" for pickles and fruit; and 1" for vegetables. If spoilage occurs, the food will be discarded. Entries must have been prepared by the exhibitor.

Judging will be based on: Selection of Raw Product – 50%; Quality – 25%; Appearance – 25%.

Class 117 – Jellies, Jams & Preserves

A clear, bright jelled product made from fruit juice. Its texture is tender, but must be firm enough to hold its shape when the jar is turned, or when it is removed from the jar. Preserves have large to medium size chunks of fruit that holds their shape. Jam is a thick puree mixture that is cooked until the pieces of fruit are very soft and almost formless.
