

4-H Dairy Judging Contest

The 2018 Mississippi 4-H Dairy Judging Contest will be held on **Friday**, **April 6**, **2018**, at the Bearden Dairy Research Center in Starkville. Contest registration will begin at 8:30 a.m., and the contest will begin at 9:00 a.m. If you are interested in participating in this contest, call the Pearl River County Extension Service Office at 601-403-2280 by **12:00 noon on Monday**, **April 2**, **2018**. The contest will be open to junior and senior 4-H teams and individuals.

4-H Livestock Judging Contest

The 2018 Mississippi 4-H Livestock Judging Contest will be held on **Saturday, May 19**, **2018**, at the MSU South Farm Beef Unit in Starkville. If you are interested in participating in this contest, call the Pearl River County Extension Service Office at 601-403-2280 by **Friday, May 11**, **2018 at 5:00 p.m.** The contest will be open to junior and senior 4-H teams and individuals.

Auburn University Block and Bridle Livestock Judging Contest

The Auburn University Block and Bridle Club and the Department of Animal Science will be hosting a 4-H/FFA judging contest on **Saturday**, **April 28**, **2018**, **at the Stanley P. Wilson Beef Unit on Auburn University's campus**. Registration begins at 8:00 a.m., and the contest begins at 9:00 a.m. The entry fee is \$10.00 per contestant, including coaches (includes lunch). Entry forms are due in the county office by **Monday**, **April 9**, **2018**. Teams and individuals are welcome to participate. The contest will follow 4-H livestock judging rules. Species that will be judged are beef cattle, sheep or goats and swine. There will be oral questions and reasons (1 set of questions and 1 set of reasons for juniors and 1 set of questions and 2 sets of reasons for seniors).

MSU Livestock Judging Camps

Are you interested in learning more about livestock judging? If so, one of the MSU Livestock Judging Camps may be for you. Two three-day camps will be held on May 12-14 and May 28-30, 2018 for 4-H'ers ages 14 and up. These camps will entail a combination of classroom lectures, live animal evaluation on the farm, oral reasons and lab exercises. The registration form and fee of \$225 per person (includes meals and lodging) are due in the Pearl River County Extension Service Office by **Wednesday, April 18, 2018**.

On June 2, two day camps will be held for 4-H'ers ages 9-18. You can choose from the morning session or the afternoon session (on a first-come, first-served basis). Adults may go through this camp also. They will need to register and pay as well. The focus of the day camps will be to develop an understanding of the basics of evaluation and judging, as well as general note-taking methods. There will be no actual delivery of reasons during the day camps. The registration form and fee of \$40 per person (includes snacks) is due in the Pearl River County Extension Service Office by **Wednesday**, **April 18, 2018**.



County Contests Day

Call the Pearl River County Extension Service Office at 601-403-2280 by Thursday, April 26, 2018, to let us know your contest selections so we can prepare for County Contests Day and enter you for Project Achievement Day or State 4-H Congress. There is a limit to the number of visual presentations per project area per county. If you are a senior 4-H'er and want to enter the Career Pursuit Contest, you will need to get your resume to the Pearl River County Extension Service Office by Monday, April 23, 2018. Call the office at 601-403-2280 for more information.

Share the Fun

Do you have a talent you want to show off? If so, the Share the Fun Contest is for you. It will be held at County Contests Day. Your act should be 3 to 5 minutes in length and can be vocal, instrumental, dance, drama/reading, or a combination. Acts will be scored as follows: costume/dress-10 points, talent/ability-40 points, performance/showmanship-35 points, originality/appropriateness-10 points, and audience response-5 points. The categories are Cloverleaf (5-7), Junior (8-13), and Senior (14-18). Groups and individuals will compete in the same categories. You can compete once as an individual and once in a group. If you are one of the top 3 Junior acts, you can go to Project Achievement Day or if you are one of the top 3 Senior acts, you can go to State 4-H Congress to compete. Call or come by the office for a form if you plan to participate in the Share the Fun Contest. The forms are due by **Thursday, April 26, 2018.**

Fashion Show

The county Fashion Show will also be held on County Contests Day. You can either make an outfit (clothing construction) or select and purchase an outfit (clothing selection) to model in the Fashion Show. You can choose to compete in 1 of 4 different levels for clothing construction. There will be winners in each level. There will be a junior and a senior division for clothing selection. 


PEARL RIVER COUNTY 4-H LIVESTOCK ASSOCIATION



Cloverleaf Exhibits

Cloverleaf Exhibits tell a story to the audience about a 4-H'er's project. The exhibit should include a poster or sign with the title, and props/materials should be used to convey the story about the 4-H project. Judges ask the 4-H'ers one-on-one questions regarding their projects. Everything must fit on a small table no larger than a card table, and the exhibit should be less than 3' x 3'. **Science fair three-sided boards should NOT be used.**

Visual Presentations

A visual presentation is a speech given with the assistance of visual aids such as posters, PowerPoint, charts, models, photographs, or actual objects. COOKERY CONTEST BASIC RULES:

- 1. Contestants may enter one (1) dish in each commodity category (3 dishes total....

 A contestant may enter a pecan dessert, a pecan appetizer/salad and/or a chicken dish)
- 2. The dish must be prepared the night before & chilled in refrigerator.
- 3. Dish must be transported to the contest on ice in an ice chest.
- **4.** The contestant must be a Pearl River County 4-H club member. All contests are open to Junior and Senior 4-H'ers, and contestants will compete together. Select categories are open to Cloverbuds.
- 5. Contestants should bring a dish prepared by the contestant to the contest. A <u>copy of the</u> <u>recipe</u> must accompany the dish, and the recipe must be written or typed on an $8\frac{1}{2}\times11$ sheet of paper. The recipe must make only one standard dish. The **ENTIRE** dish must be exhibited at the contest, i.e. if a recipe yields one cake then the entire cake must be entered and displayed. Anything used to enhance the appearance of the dish <u>must be in</u> or <u>on the serving</u> container.

**DISHES NOT CHILLED & TRANSPORTED ON ICE IN AN ICE CHEST WILL BE DISQUALIFIED.

Division Rules:

- You may enter 1 dish in each category (3 dishes total....one dish in pecan dessert, one dish in a pecan appetizer/salad and/or one dish in a chicken dish.
- Each 1st place dish will compete at the Southeast District Cookery Contest

PECANS: minimum of $\frac{1}{2}$ cup pecans must be used; may be whole, chopped, halves or pieces

COOKERY CONTEST BASIC RULES:

- 1. Contestants may enter one (1) dish in each category. (8 dishes total)
- 2. The dish must be prepared the night before & chilled in refrigerator.
- 3. Dish must be transported to the contest on ice in an ice chest.
- **4**. The contestant must be a Pearl River County 4-H club member. All contests are open to Junior and Senior 4-H'ers, and contestants will compete together. Select categories are open to Cloverbuds.
- 5. Contestants should bring a dish prepared by the contestant to the contest. A <u>copy of the</u> <u>recipe</u> must accompany the dish, and the recipe must be written or typed on an $8\frac{1}{2} \times 11$ sheet of paper. A "sample recipe" will be issued to 4-H'ers the month preceding the contest. The recipe must make only one standard dish. The **ENTIRE** dish must be exhibited at the contest, i.e. if a recipe yields one cake then the entire cake must be entered and displayed. Anything used to enhance the appearance of the dish <u>must be in</u> or <u>on the serving container</u>.

**DISHES NOT CHILLED & TRANSPORTED ON ICE IN AN ICE CHEST WILL BE DISQUALIFIED.

Division Rules:

- You may enter 1 dish in each category (8 dishes total....one dish in beef other cuts, one
 dish in ground beef appetizer, one dish in ground beef main dish, one dish in egg
 appetizer/salad, one dish in egg dessert, one dish in shrimp, one dish in crawfish and one
 dish in fish)
- Each 1st place dish will compete at the Southeast District Cookery Contest

BEEF:

- -Beef: Other Cuts...must contain a *minimum of 1 lb. of beef*, i.e. beef tips, beef loin, roasts, ribs, etc.
- -Ground Beef: Appetizer...must contain a minimum of 1 lb. of ground beef
- -Ground Beef: Main Dish...must contain a minimum of 1 lb. of ground beef

EGG: minimum of 4 eggs must be used - can be 4 whole, 4 whites, or 4 yolks, or combination.....no raw eggs in final product

- -Appetizer/Salad
- -Dessert
- **-Cloverbuds** (5-8 year old Cloverbud members can enter $\underline{\text{Desserts}}$ in this division)

SEAFOOD:

- -Shrimp...must contain a *minimum of 1 pound of shrimp* (fresh, frozen or canned)
- -Crawfish...must contain a minimum of 1 pound of crawfish (fresh or frozen)
- -Fish...must contain a *minimum of 1 cup/8 ounces of fish* (fresh, frozen or canned)
