THE WHAT, WHEN, WHERE, WHY AND HOW OF 2018 PROJECT ACHIEVEMENT DAY

This event is when you will present your cloverleaf exhibits (ages 5-8) or visual presentations (9-13) and participate in share the fun, modeling & fashion review, and judging contests. There will be a Project Achievement Day meeting on May 23, 2018 from 3:30—5:00 P.M. to prepare. It is important that you attend. If you plan to go to Project Achievement Day. If you are not able to at-

tend, please contact me for rescheduling and individual meeting times. Enclosed is a list of contests in which you might be interested in. Please look over the list and decide in which contests you would like to participate. Club Achievement Day will be held on <u>July 10</u> at Laurel Middle School. At the meeting, please let us know your contest selections so we can enter you for participating.

Do you have a talent you want to show off? If so, Share the Fun is for you. It is an act done in 3 to 5 minutes and can be vocal, instrumental, dance, drama/reading, or combination. Acts will be scored as follows: costume/dress— 10 points, talent/ability— 40 points, performance/showmanship—35 points, originality/appropriateness— 10 points, and audience response—5 points. The categories are cloverleaf (ages 5-7), junior (8-13), and senior (14-18). Groups and individuals will compete in the same categories. You can compete once as an individual and once in a group. Let us know if you want to participate in the Share the Fun.

Modeling Squad or Fashion Review is where you can either make an outfit (clothing construction) or select and purchase an outfit (clothing selection) to model at Project Achievement Day. You can choose to compete in 1 of 4 different levels of clothing construction. You will model your outfit and give reasons to a judge telling why you chose that outfit.

DISTRICT AND STATE 4-H HORSE SHOWS

The Southeast District Horse Show will be held **June 7-8, 2018** at the Harrison County Fairgrounds in Gulfport, the State Horse Show will be held in **June 19-23, 2018** in Jackson, and the Regional 4-H Horse Show will be held **August 1-5, 2018**, in Perry, Georgia. You don't have to own a horse to participate in the 4-H Horse project! There are several non-riding horse events in which you can participate. You can enter the Horse Art, Horse Photography, Horse Judging, Hippology, Team or Individual Horse Demonstrations, Horse Bowl, Horse Public Speaking, and T-shirt art contests.
