EMPLOYMENT AND INCOME IMPACTS

Forest-related economic activity in Hancock County during 2013 generated 252 jobs and over \$4.3 million in income. Employment is the number of full- and part-time jobs in all sectors of the economy. Income is salaries and wages paid to employees.

TOTAL OUTPUT AND VALUE ADDED IMPACTS

Forestry and the forest products industry generated more than \$14.6 million in Hancock County. Forest-related value added amounted to more than \$5.8 million. The value of all goods and services produced is defined as total output. Value added is a portion of total output and represents the creation of new wealth.

TAX IMPACTS

Forest-related economic activity contributed an estimated \$1.4 million in tax revenue for federal, state, and local governments. This total includes tax revenue of \$665 thousand for federal and \$704 thousand for state and local governments.
