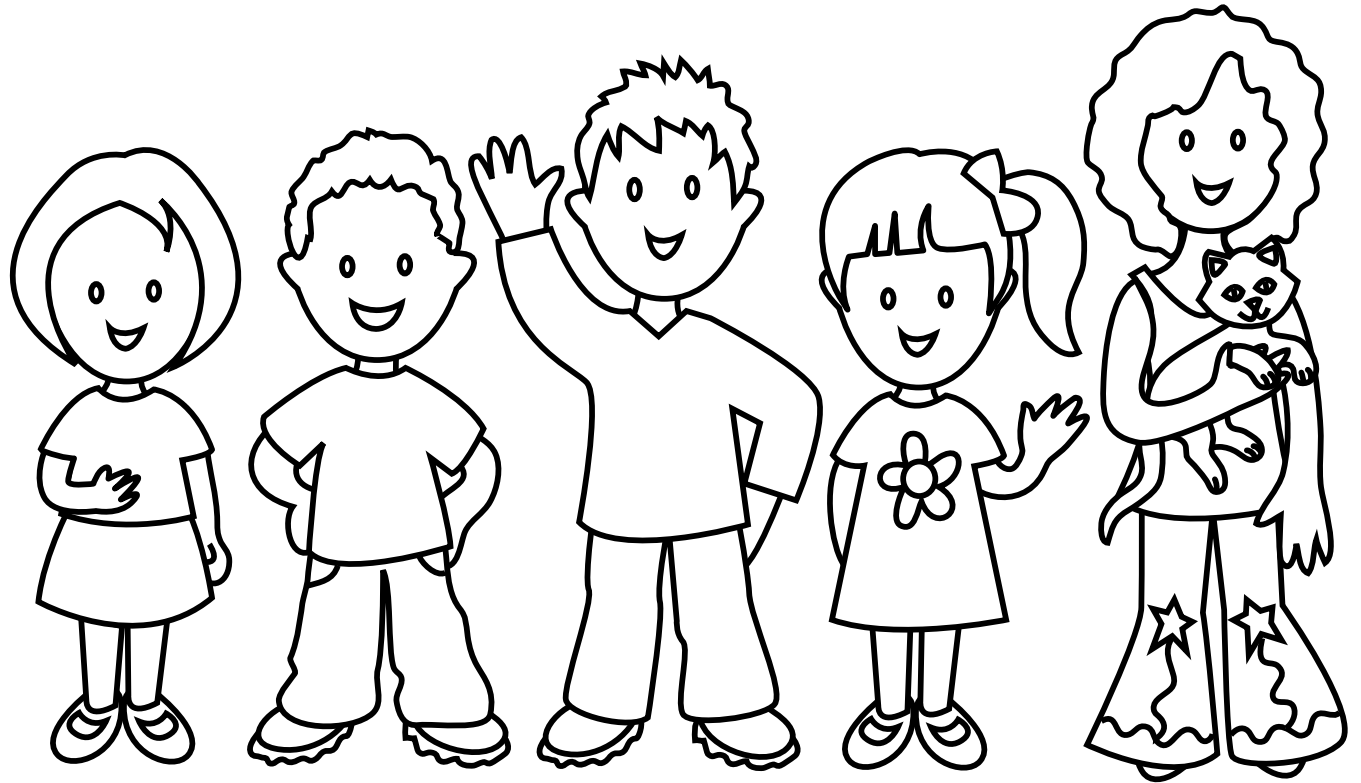

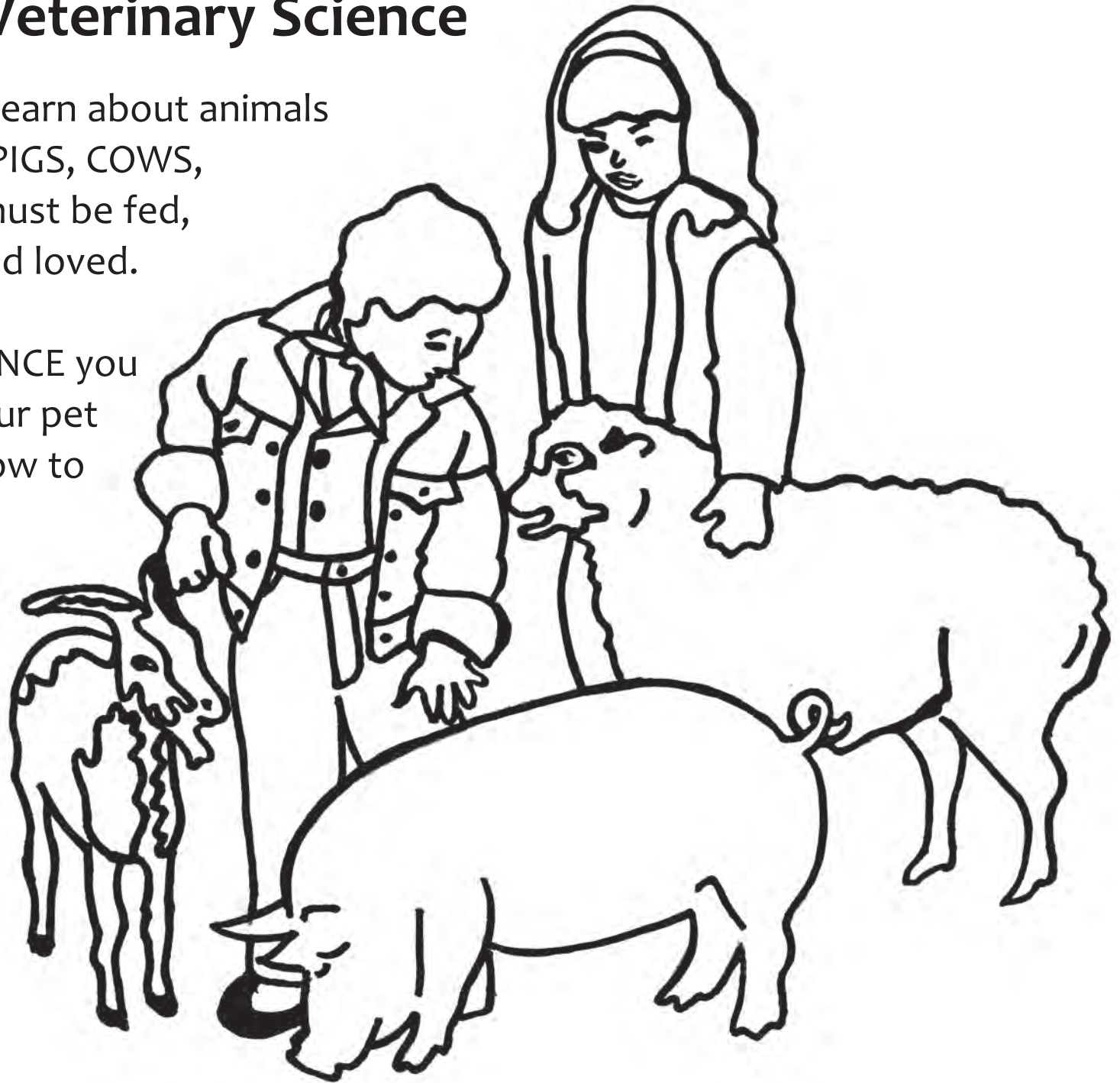

In VETERINARY SCIENCE you can learn to keep your pet healthy and know how to tell if he is sick.



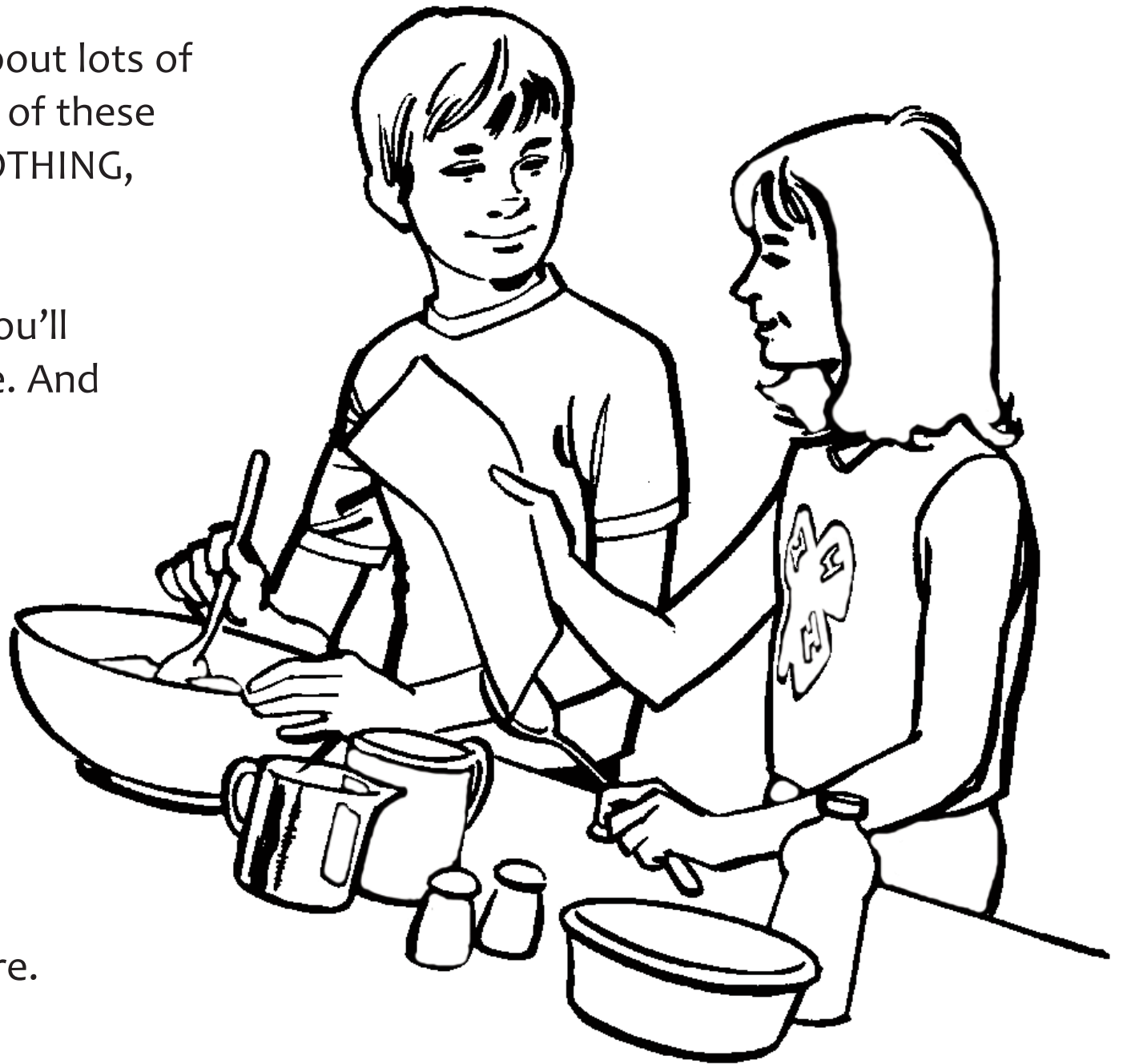
Foods, Clothing, and Childcare

You can become a better baby sitter by learning about childcare.

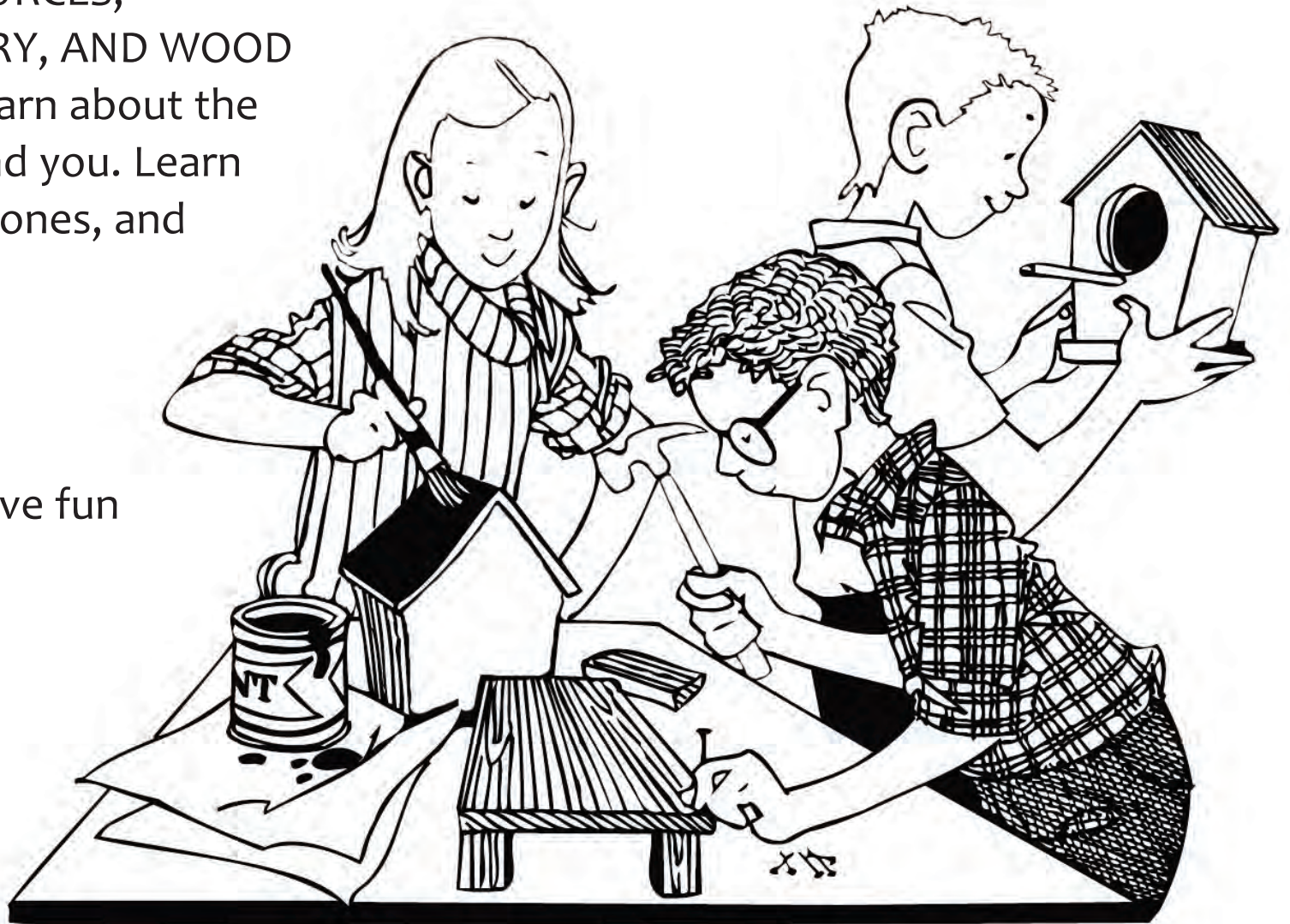


Natural Resources, Wildlife, Forestry, and Wood Science

Come join a 4-H club!

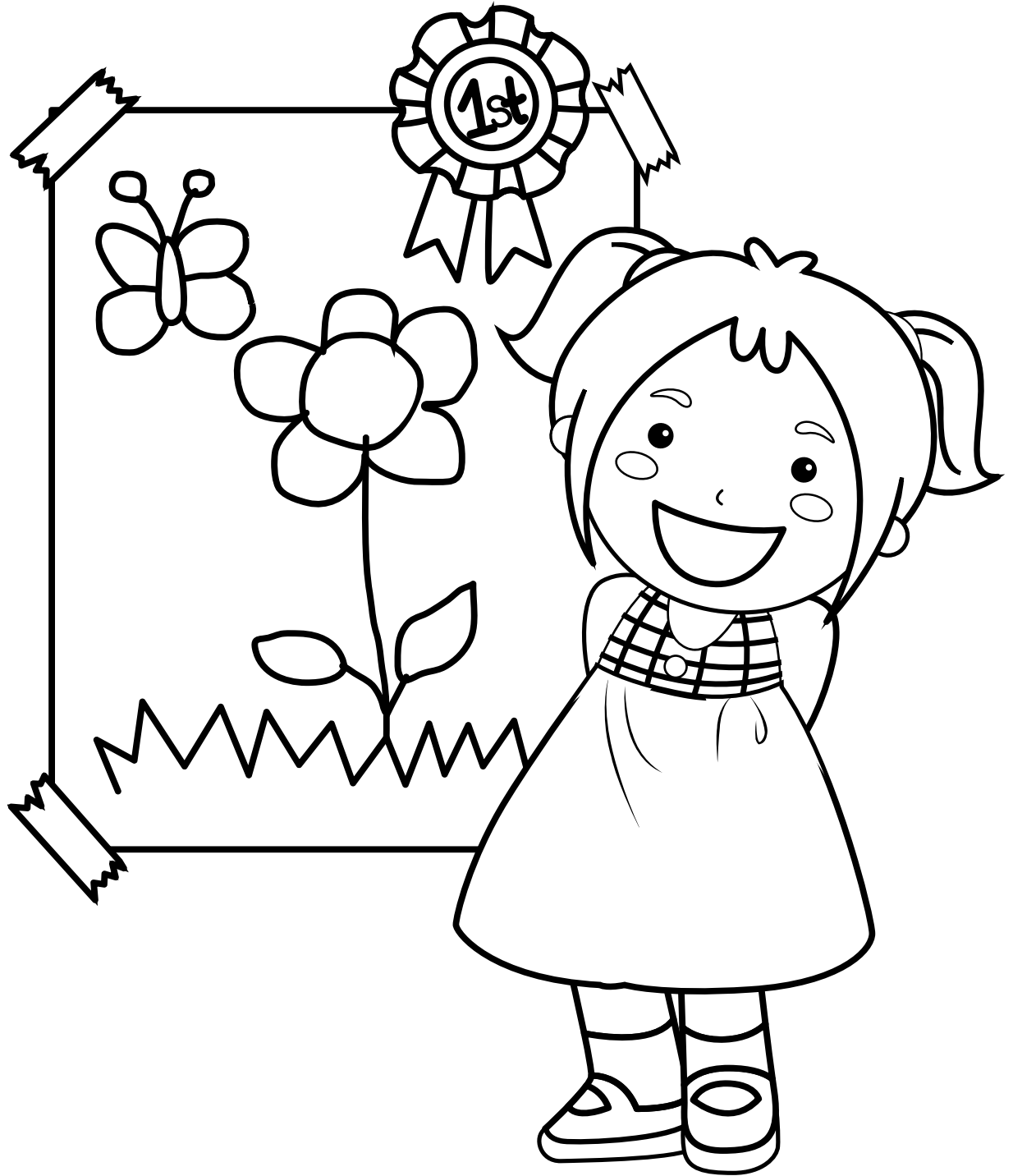
4-H'ers learn, lead, and have fun at their club meetings in their neighborhoods.



4-H'ers enjoy helping others.

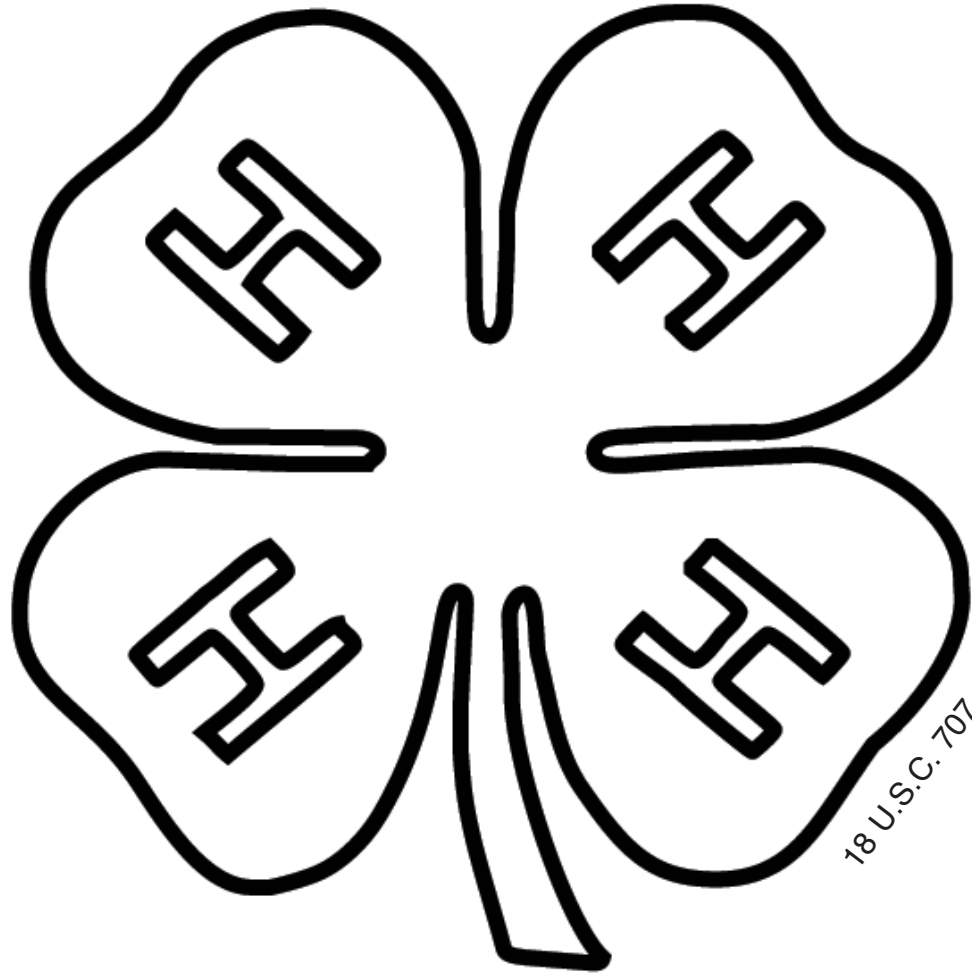


4-H'ers can also show what they have learned and the new skills they have acquired with their 4-H projects.
