SUBJECT: Mississippi 4-H Volunteer Leaders' Association's Annual Leadership Conference

The Mississippi 4-H Volunteer Leaders' Association's (MVLA) Annual Leadership Conference will be held February 27-28, 2026, in the Bost Extension Conference Center. The conference will begin with registration at 4:00 p.m. Friday, and conclude Saturday by 4:00 p.m. This year we are doing a drawing for a **Grand Prize** at the end of the auction following the awards banquet on Friday and one at the end of the conference on Saturday! *You must be present to win so plan to stay for the whole, fun-filled conference!*

The MVLA Annual Leadership Conference provides an excellent opportunity for 4-H Volunteers, Extension faculty and friends of 4-H to participate in outstanding experiential learning activities, workshops, great fellowship, and enlightening entertainment. The theme this year is **"Ask Me About MVLA"**. We encourage you and the 4-H Volunteer Leaders from your county to plan to share in this event. **The Torchbearer Award will be presented to the agent (or volunteer) that brings the most Volunteers from their county to the Conference, so get out there and recruit Volunteers from your county to attend!**

The Leadership Conference will open with an informal reception from 4:00 – 5:00 p.m. followed by an awards banquet Friday evening, February 27, in the Bost Extension Conference Center. Outstanding 4-H Volunteers in each of the following categories will be recognized:

1. **Harvey Gordon Rising Star Outstanding Volunteer** Award Category – 4-H Volunteers who have served 1-3 years.
2. **Outstanding Volunteer of the Year** Award Category – 4-H Volunteers who have served 4-10 years.
3. **Ruby Beckley Lifetime Outstanding Volunteer of the Year** Award Category – 4-H Volunteers who have served more than 10 years.

Applications for the above awards and MVLA Officer nominations are due by January 30, 2026. Nomination forms will be sent in a separate email and will be available online. This is a great way to recognize the Outstanding Volunteers who work hard to encourage, teach, and support our Youth!

If you have a volunteer who has 50 or more years of service as a 4-H volunteer, please let us know if they will attend as we would like to recognize them during the awards banquet. Other years of service awards are recognized at the North and South Forums later in the year.

Please encourage all delegates to bring items valued at a minimum of \$25 for the Live and Tea Cup Auctions, as well as items for the Silent Auction. The auctions serve as the main fundraiser for the Mississippi 4-H Volunteer Leaders' Association and will be held at scheduled times during the

Conference. The auctions always provide many exciting moments and attendees are encouraged to outbid each other while enjoying the fast-paced action. The Tea Cup Auction is a new addition this year. You will have the opportunity to purchase tickets. Each item will have a bag or box into which you will place tickets for the items you choose. You can place as many tickets as you like in the bag or box for items that you want. One ticket will be drawn from the bag or box for each item to select the winner of the item. Everyone that purchases tickets has a chance to win! A donation request letter from the MVLA President is available. **The Go Getter Award will be presented to the person bringing the most auction items (valued at least \$25.00 each)!** Each county is also encouraged to bring **two door prizes** to be given away throughout the Conference.

We will also offer the game of Heads or Tails this year. This is a fun opportunity to win prizes. Those who choose to purchase a \$5.00 glow bracelet will be eligible to play. The Heads or Tails game will be played at various times during the Conference. More details will be provided at the Conference.

This year, registration for **first-time attendees** will be **\$100.00** for the entire Conference. Registration for full-time return delegates is **\$130.00**. Full-time registration fees include the Friday reception and banquet meal, Saturday lunch and snacks, Conference t-shirt, and MVLA annual membership. Volunteers are responsible for their own lodging arrangements.

Please Note: This year we will be collecting items for a Community Service Project, Bully's Pantry. The goal of this project is to provide non-perishable food items, personal care items, and school supplies to current Mississippi State University students in need. A list of suggested items is included in this packet. Please bring items to donate for this worthwhile project!

Please submit registration and workshop selection for each delegate via the Extension Intranet. **Extension Agents must register each adult participant online.** The registration link will be emailed at a later time, so watch your email. The county delegation form sent with the registration fees to the MVLA treasurer **does NOT** register them for the Conference and workshops. **Registration closes January 30, 2026.** Please make registration fees/checks payable to MVLA. Do **NOT** include workshop fees with registration fees; these will be need to be paid at the workshop during the Conference.
