

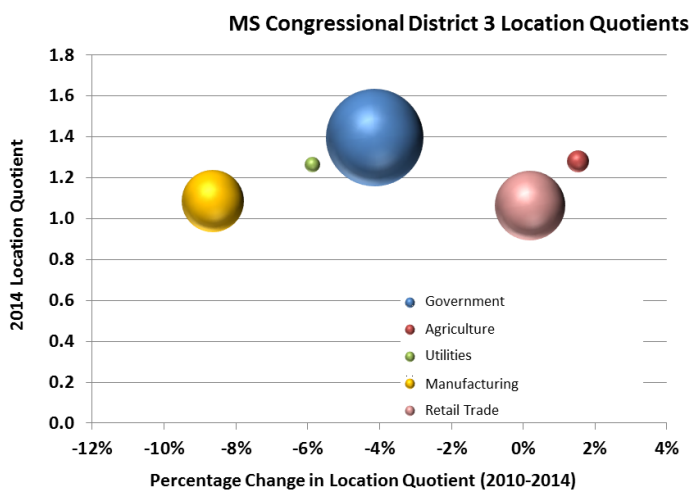

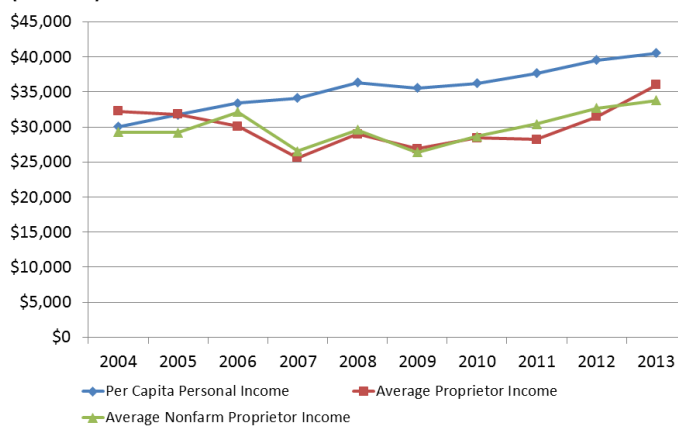
The industry is relatively concentrated in the county (LQ > 1.5) but neither expanding nor declining
