1986 HARVEST OF FOREST PRODUCTS

July, 1987

The 1986 harvest of \$477 million was 2 percent lower than the 1985 harvest of \$488 million, primarily due to lower prices for many products and lower demand for pulpwood. In the first six months of 1986, the pulpwood market in Mississippi was very poor. A dry, mild winter in 1985-86 created good logging conditions during a time when pulpwood supply is normally low. The dry winter combined with Southern pine beetle infestations caused a bulge in the supply of pine pulpwood to the market that wasn't absorbed until mid-summer. Hence, our pine pulpwood harvest was down nearly 4 percent but hardwood pulpwood increased more than 11 percent to boost the 1986 total pulpwood harvest nearly 2 percent above 1985. Pulpwood prices, however, were lower than in 1985.

In 1986 harvested sawtimber volumes increased significantly while prices were slightly lower compared to 1985. The pine sawlog harvest increased 26 percent while the hardwood sawlog harvest increased 38 percent. Much of this increase can be attributed to two major factors: improving demand for both pine and hardwood timber late in 1986 and changes in the timber tax law which eliminated capital gains treatment for timber sale income after January 1, 1987. The changing tax law stimulated a flurry of timber sales late in 1986 to take advantage of the capital gains provision.

Severence tax collections for 1986 were \$3,072,479.84, nearly 10 percent above the 1985 severence tax total. Twenty percent of the severence tax collections were returned to the counties where the timber was harvested. Eighty percent went to the Forest Resource Development Program (FRDP) to provide cost-share assistance for tree planting and other forestry practices on private forestland.

Estimated value of the 1986 timber harvest is shown in the following table. Average prices were taken from the MCES Timber Price Report, except where otherwise noted. The average delivered pulpwood prices are for pulpwood delivered to the local pulpwood yard gate.
