Empowering Small Ruminant Producers

Small Ruminant Production Workshop was held at Mississippi State University on March 17, 2018. The goals of the workshop were to provide basic information related to the production of small ruminant livestock to participants. The speakers

empowered the participants in key areas including marketing, budgeting, forages, parasite control, breed selection, reproduction, poisonous plants, and carcass breakdown for selling sheep and goat meat products. In addition to the presentations, the program also included a producer panel that provided real time hands on testimonials on production in our state as well as a display of the various forage species that can be grown in our state for small ruminant production.



This event was organized by Rocky Lemus of the Department of Plant and Soil Science and ~~Kipp~~ Kipp Brown and Erdogan Memili of the Department of Animal and Dairy Sciences. The workshop was attended by goat and sheep producers from across Mississippi as well as a few producers from other states including Alabama, California, and Louisiana. Dairy Judging Contest

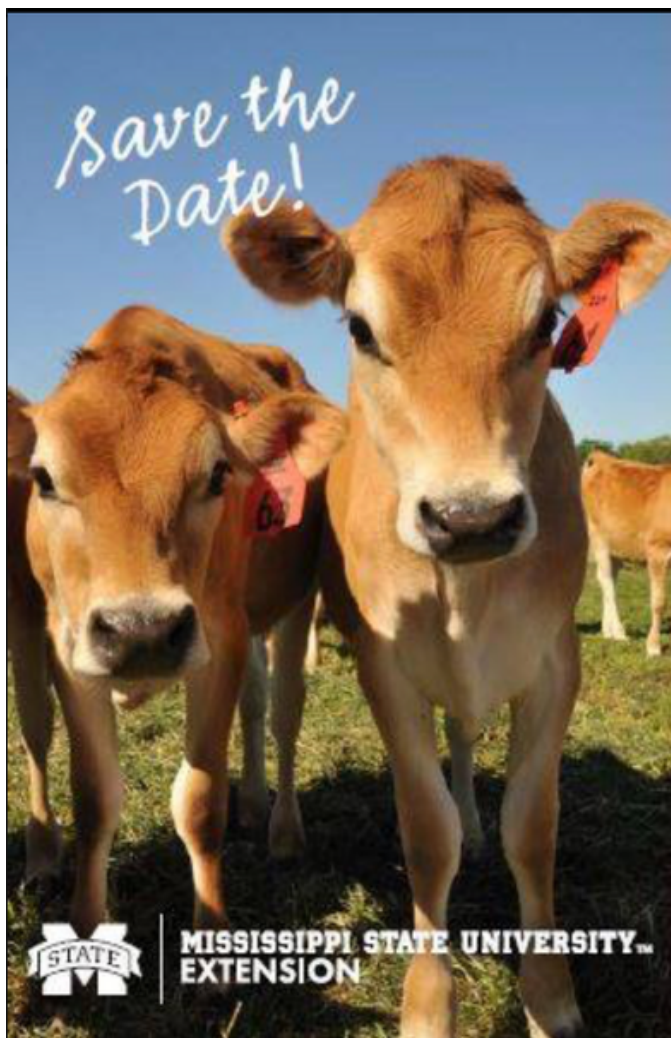

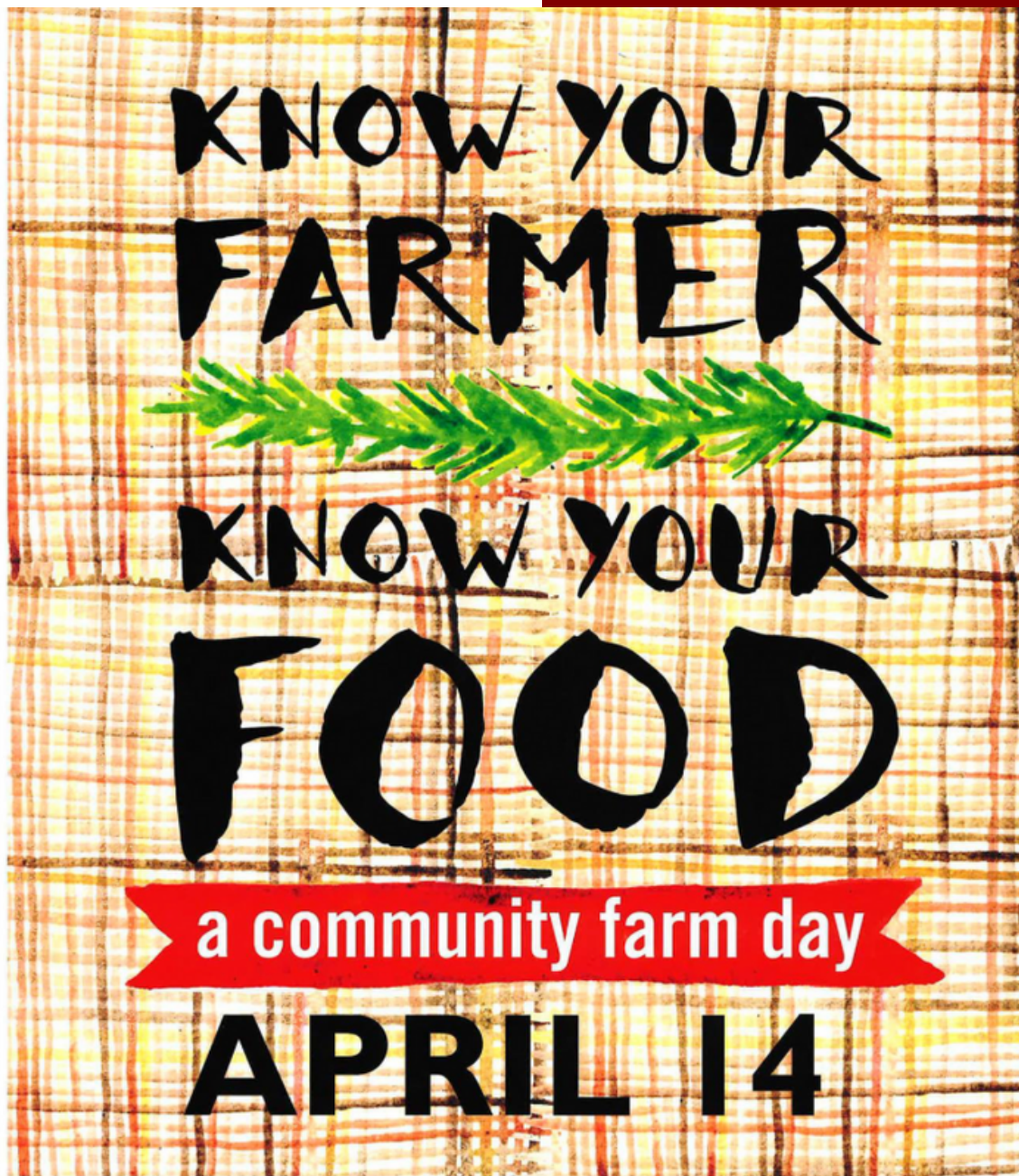
