The Mississippi Timber Price Report provides a picture of timber market activity showing regional and statewide stumpage prices for common forest products.


This report should only be used as a guide to help individuals monitor timber market trends. The average price should not be applied as fair market value for a specific timber sale because many variables influence actual prices each landowner will receive. How are prices obtained?

This report used data from 72 timber sales conducted and reported across Mississippi during 1st quarter 2025. Reporters include forest product companies, logging contractors, consulting foresters, landowners, and other natural resource professionals.

Price Trends

Statewide average stumpage prices for the first quarter of 2025 are summarized in Tables 1 and 2 for pine and hardwood products, respectively. Most timber products saw an increase in prices compared to the previous quarter, except for pine topwood and mixed hardwood sawtimber, which decreased.

Pine sawtimber prices increased to \$21.94/ton, up \$1.33 from the previous quarter. Oak sawtimber prices significantly increased by more than \$3.50/ton (~10%), after falling in the previous quarter. Mixed hardwood sawtimber prices, however, decreased by about 6.3%. The pulpwood market saw some improvement, with pine pulpwood prices increasing to \$3.57/ton and hardwood pulpwood prices increasing to \$6.20/ton. Keep in mind, prices vary for some product classes across regions due to localized market conditions. Timber prices for a particular timber stand are influenced by timber species, quality and size of the trees, site accessibility, local timber inventory, mill types and capacities, logging capabilities, transportation capacity, and more.

The broader wood products market also improved this quarter, with Southern pine lumber prices going up, although Southern OSB prices dropped. Housing starts and building permits declined compared to the same quarter last year, but remodeling activity increased. Natural gas and diesel prices went up, while crude oil prices were down.

Looking ahead, stumpage prices are expected to increase in the second quarter due to seasonal wet weather. However, Mississippi's abundant standing timber supply will continue to exert downward pressure on prices. Despite this, there is a positive momentum in the industry, with ongoing progress in mill expansions and new mill construction projects.




Figure 1: Average Mississippi pine sawtimber, pine chip-n-saw, and mixed hardwood sawtimber stumpage prices (\$/ton) for 1st quarter 2018 through 1st quarter 2025. *


