Deep South Stocker Conference this Month

The fourth annual Deep South Stocker Conference returns to Mississippi. This year's conference will be held August 10, 2012 at Kahlmus Auditorium on Mississippi State University's Meridian campus. This conference is a joint effort between the Alabama Cooperative Extension System, the Mississippi State University Extension Service, and the University of Georgia Cooperative Extension.

This year's conference will be a one-day event with several educational seminars in the morning, and a tour of a stocker operator that afternoon. Registration for the conference will cost \$75/person. The seminars will cover pertinent topics in economics and marketing, forage management, health, and nutrition. In addition, a trade show will be held in conjunction with the conference to allow stocker operators the opportunity to network with industry professionals and to become aware of products and services that can improve their profitably and product quality.




Beef Cattle Producer Survey Results—Management Practices

Last month’s MBCIA newsletter presented recent Mississippi and Southeast U.S. beef cattle producer survey calving seasons, cattle weights, and annual cow cost results. This month management practice use is highlighted. Once again this give producers information with which to compare their own data to see how they compare to other beef


producer in these areas. It also reveals where overall improvements in the industry can be made. The other Southeastern U.S. states represented in the responses included Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Louisiana, North Carolina, South Carolina, and Tennessee.

MS: n = 58; Other states: n = 69


Rate your use of the following nutrition/forage management practices: (Never = 1 to Frequently = 5)



MS: n = 58; Other states: n = 71



Key survey results include the following:

- Mississippi producers surveyed reported more frequent use of reproductive management practices than producers in other Southeast states
- Implementation of reproductive management practices across the board are a key area in which improvements can be made
- Mineral and vitamin supplementation was reported to be the most frequently used nutritional management practice

- There is notable room for improvement in the use of forage nutrient analysis for nutritional management
- Reported use of biosecurity and Beef Quality Assurance practices have sizeable room for improvement
- In general, parasite control and vaccination practice use was quite frequent among the producers surveyed
- Producers reported more frequent use of individual cattle identification and castration practices than implant, dehorning, or early weaning practices



2011 National Beef Quality Audit Information Online

The National Beef Quality Audit (NBQA) is a comprehensive survey that evaluates beef industry efforts to improve beef quality. Conducted every five years since 1991, the checkoff-funded Audit assesses progress the industry makes on a variety of production issues that ultimately affect consumer demand for beef. Extensive enhancements were made to the 2011 NBQA design to provide the industry with direction on factors beyond the physical characteristics of beef, such as food safety, sustainability, animal well-being, and the disconnect between agricultural producers and consumers.
