Registration opens April 4, 2022 and closes June 14, 2022.

The 4-H Junior STEAM Day is open to 4-H youth, ages 5-13 years old as of January 1, 2022. Cloverbuds (5–7-yearolds) may participate but they are not scored. All Cloverbuds will receive a certificate of participation. For Cloverbuds, the focus is on the experience and building communication skills and confidence. Juniors (8–13year-olds) are scored and will be ranked.

Participants may compete in more than one contest. Each contest has a water theme (water conservation, water cycle, water and disease prevention, etc.). SPIKE Robotics Contest (Team)

Junior 4-H'ers work in teams of 3-4 youth using the LEGO SPIKE robot. They will program the SPIKE robot to complete challenges on the contest mat. Counties located in the TVA region may request to borrow a SPIKE robot. Online training is available. The mat cost \$25. The mat and the rubric were handed out at the 4-H MVLA forum in February. Counties may bring 2 teams.

#### LEGO Build Contest (Individual)

#### Age: Cloverbud / Junior

4-H'ers will build a LEGO based project that reflects the theme of "water." All builds should fit inside a disposable aluminum pan. If using water, please bring a bottle of water with you. Water should stay inside the pan. Youth should be prepared to present their project (3-5 minutes) and answer questions. Counties may bring 4 participants.



### **Opportunities for Graduating Seniors!**

Apply to attend Mississippi State University and for all the scholarships before August 1, 2022! All MS 4-H members meeting the GPA and testing criteria will receive \$500. If the freshman was the pick for the County's Outstanding 4-H member for the year, they will receive an additional \$1,000.

#### JoAnne Nicholson 4-H/FFA Scholarship

This is a one-time \$1,000 scholarship for Newton County 4-H/FFA members. Recipient must be an active 4-H/FFA member and must have been active in the horse or livestock project. Recipient must maintain a 2.5 GPA and must be a senior in high school or already enrolled in college or vocational program. Applications are available in the Newton County Extension Office. The deadline to apply is May 16.

#### **MHV 4-H Scholarship**

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Available to any graduating senior 4-H club member from any high school or home-school in Newton County if they are an active member of Newton 4-H. The amount of the scholarship will be no less than \$200 determined annually by the county MHV Council. The applicant must have three or more years of 4-H work in Newton County. Applications are available in the Newton County Extension Office. The deadline to apply is May 16.

# **4-H Horse Program**

In order to compete in the 4-H Horse Shows for 2022, **you must prove your ownership by May 1, 2022.** The Southeast District Horse Show is June 9-10 at the Lauderdale County Agricenter. The State Horse Show is June 22-25 at the Mississippi Coliseum.



Submit your best horse art - there are different divisions to enter. (1) Pastels/Charcoal/Graphite/ Colored Pencil (Abstract or Realistic); (2) Oil/ Acrylic/Water Color (Abstract or Realistic); (3) Pen/Ink/Markers/Crayon (Abstract or Realistic); (4) Cartoon (Single Frame or Strip); (5) Sculpture/3-D (Abstract or Realistic); (6) Mixed, Altered Media, Other; (7) Home Furnishings; (8) Welded items

There is a Junior and Senior division so you will compete against kids your age. Please contact our office if you would like to submit your art - entries will be due June 8.

## What is a Coggins test and why do I need one – why is it required?

To show your horse, a current Coggins test is required. The Coggins test is named for Dr. Leroy Coggins, the veterinarian who developed the test to detect antibodies against the equine infectious anemia virus (EIA) in 1970. Once infected with EIA, the horse remains infected for life and is a potential infection point for other healthy horses – the disease is transmitted by biting, blood sucking insects. Infections in horses are rare but incurable and there is no vaccine against the disease. Identifying horses who are carrying the virus is critical to the safety of others. 4-H Horse Shows require a negative Coggins test within 12 months of the show date.

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#### MS 4-H Idol Contests Rules

- Age: 8-18 as of January 1, 2022. All members of a Group performance must meet age requirements. Jr. Division: 8-13 | Sr.: 14-18.
- The contestant's talent performance shall not exceed 4 minutes. Contestants will be disqualified if time limit is exceeded.
- If an accompanist is needed, it is the responsibility of the contestant to obtain one. Vocalists may use a CD of cell phone for accompaniment, but it may not have vocals on it. Tracks containing voices will not be allowed to be used.
- Contestants must bring their own special equipment, props, etc. Contestants must be able to carry prop(s) on stage. Microphones and sound system will be provided.
- Tracks containing voices will not be allowed to be used. Pre-recorded music must be submitted on a CD containing only the cut of music used for the talent performance. 4-H nor its contractors will be responsible for cueing music on CD's with multiple tracks.
- Chosen songs must contain appropriate lyrics—no lewd or inappropriate language. Any performance containing inappropriate language will result in immediate disqualification from the competition.
- Contestants will be judged by a committee. This committee will make the final determination as to whether a contestant is qualified to participate in the state contest.
- Judging will be on the following basis: Appropriate costume or dress – 10 pts | Showmanship – 20 pts | Talent – 70 pts




