Jefferson County

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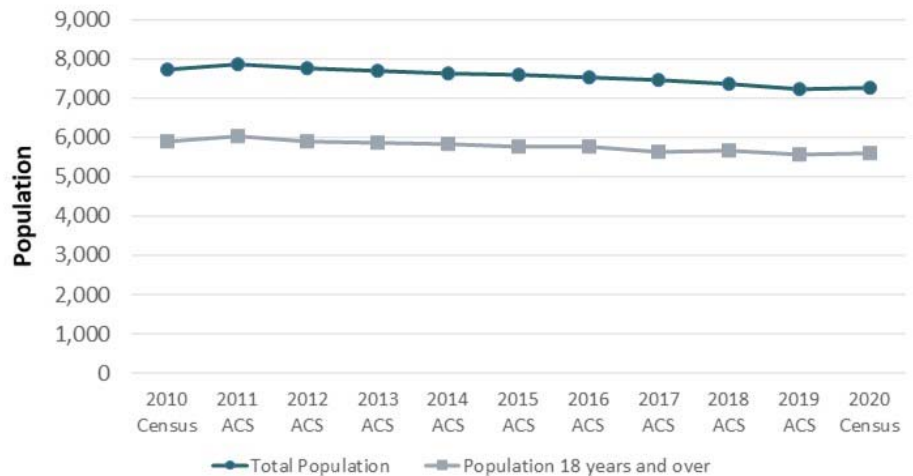
Data in this report are gathered from the 2010 Census (data.census.gov), the 2011-2019 American Community Survey (ACS) 5-year Population Estimates (data.census.gov), and the 2020 Census Redistricting Data (census.gov).

This graphic presents the total population and the population for residents 18 years and over using data from the 2010 Census, the 2011-2019 American Community Survey (ACS) survey estimates, and the 2020 Census.

If relatively large deviations between the 2020 Census and either the 2010 Census or the 2011-2019 ACS estimates are evident, consider questioning the 2020 Census counts. These deviations **could** be an indication of an error in the 2020 Census counts.

If an error appears likely, consider contacting your regional planning and development district and other funding agencies for further information, particularly for grant funding possibilities.
