
## **Census Populations (2010-2020)**

This graphic presents the total population and the population for residents 18 years and over using data from the 2010 Census, the 2011-2019 American Community Survey (ACS) survey estimates, and the 2020 Census. If relatively large deviations between the 2020 Census and either the 2010 Census or the 2011-2019 ACS estimates are evident, consider questioning the 2020 Census counts. These deviations **could** be an indication of an error in the 2020 Census counts. Data in this report are gathered from the 2010 Census (data.census.gov), the 2011-2019 American Community Survey (ACS) 5-year Population Estimates (data.census.gov), and the 2020 Census Redistricting Data (census.gov).
